The Committee of the Whole, to which PR 22-770, the "Citizen Review Panel Shana N. Bartley Appointment Resolution of 2018" was referred, reports favorably thereon, and recommends approval by the Council.

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I. BACKGROUND AND NEED

On February 27, 2018, PR 22-770, the "Citizen Review Panel Shana N. Bartley Appointment Resolution of 2018" was introduced by Chairman Mendelson. PR 22-770 was referred to the Committee of the Whole on March 6, 2018. The purpose of PR 22-770 is to appoint Ms. Bartley as a member of the Citizen Review Panel for a three-year term.

Ms. Bartley is a Ward 6 resident. Ms. Bartley received her Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology from Washington University in St. Louis and her Master of Science in Public Health in Health Policy from Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. Currently, she serves as the Acting Executive Director of DC Action for Children. In this role Ms. Bartley focuses on setting the vision and devising a strategy for the organization so it can meet its goals of improving outcomes for children regardless of race/ethnicity, family's income, or zip code. Before assuming the role as Acting Executive Director, Ms. Bartley served as a Senior Policy Analyst, Policy &

Program Manager, and Director of Programs and Legislative Affairs at DC Action for Children. Before joining DC Action for Children, she was a Senior Program Coordinator at the Young Women's Project. In addition, Ms. Bartley served as a Fellow at the Children's Health Leadership Network and as a member of the Board of Directors for the Young Women's Project. Also, she is currently serving a three-year term on the State Early Childhood Development Coordinating Council.

In 2004, the Council approved the Child in Need of Protection Amendment Act (2004 Act).¹ The purpose of the 2004 Act was to reform the District's child protection law. More importantly, the goal of the Council was to create a seamless and effective system for responding to any type of child mistreatment, whether it was child abandonment, abuse, or neglect.² One of the outcomes of the 2004 Act was to codify the establishment of the Citizen Review Panel (Panel). The Panel serves as an independent oversight body for the District's child welfare system and to evaluate the District government agencies involved in child protection as well as services provided by vendors.³

Prior to the 2004 Act, the Panel was created administratively because Congress mandated that states and other jurisdictions establish such Panels by July 1999 pursuant to the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA).⁴ The requirement to establish a Panel was necessary to continue to receive CAPTA funds.⁵ As required by CAPTA, the Panel evaluates the District's child protection standards pursuant to a state plan required by the federal government and pursuant to child protection standards set by federal law.

The Panel consists of 15 members, all of whom must be District residents.⁶ The Mayor is required to appoint eight members of the Panel and must designate the Chairperson. The Council shall appoint seven members to the Panel and is required to designate the Vice Chairperson.⁷ Furthermore, the Panel is required to be broadly representative of the community and must include members that have expertise in the prevention and treatment of child abuse and neglect.⁸ In addition, the appointments to the Panel should have a diversity of professional backgrounds and must be familiar with the child welfare system.⁹

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Ms. Bartley indicated that as a member of the Panel she intends to collaborate with other members of the Panel to continue to strengthen the District's child welfare system.¹⁰ She plans to bring her experience and connections from DC Action for Children to bring best practices from other states work in child welfare issues back to the District to enhance the work being done by the Panel.¹¹ At the April 25th roundtable, she testified that as a member of the Panel she wants to ensure that children in the District have the resources to achieve their full potential. Additionally, Ms. Bartley was to ensure that the Panel supports families so that a child can stay with his or her family and the option of removal would be a last resort.

The Committee believes Ms. Bartley's previous experience working on child welfare issues in the District would make her a valuable addition to the Panel. The Committee also supports Ms. Bartley's goals to ensure that families are being supported and that the government continues to best serve the needs of children in the District. For the reasons mentioned above, the Committee recommends adoption of PR 22-770.

V. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

The Committee of the Whole held a public roundtable on PR 22-770 (and 3 other nominations to the Citizen Review Panel) on Wednesday, April 25, 2018. The testimony summarized below is from that roundtable. A copy of the written testimony provided to the Committee is attached to this report.

Shana N. Bartley, Appointee, testified and answered questions from Chairman Mendelson regarding her background and experience as it pertains to the Citizen Review Panel and her interest in serving on the Panel.

The Committee received no testimony or comments in opposition to Ms. Bartley's appointment.

VI. IMPACT ON EXISTING LAW

Members of the Citizen Review Panel are appointed pursuant to section 351 of the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect Act of 1977, effective April 12, 2005 (D.C. Law 15-341; D.C. Official Code § 4-1303.51), which establishes the Panel.

VII. FISCAL IMPACT

PR 22-770 will have no fiscal impact on the District of Columbia budget or financial plan. Members of the Citizen Review Panel are not entitled to compensation.

VIII. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS
