The Committee of the Whole, to which PR 22-771, the "Citizen Review Panel Sarah Schooler Appointment Resolution of 2018" was referred, reports favorably thereon, and recommends approval by the Council.

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#### I. BACKGROUND AND NEED

On February 27, 2018, PR 22-771, the "Citizen Review Panel Sarah Schooler Appointment Resolution of 2018" was introduced by Chairman Mendelson. PR 22-771 was referred to the Committee of the Whole on March 6, 2018. The purpose of PR 22-771 is to appoint Dr. Schooler as a member of the Citizen Review Panel for a three-year term.

Dr. Schooler is a Ward 4 resident. Dr. Schooler received her Bachelor of Arts in Psychology from Harvard University and her Doctor of Medicine from the University of Virginia School of Medicine. She also completed the Pediatric Residency Program at Children's National Health System. Dr. Schooler is licensed to practice medicine in Maryland and serves as a pediatrician at Silver Spring Pediatrics and at Holy Cross hospital in Silver Spring, Maryland. In addition, she is the Department Chair of the Pediatric Department at Holy Cross hospital. Previously, she served as the Chief Pediatric Resident at Children's National Health System. Furthermore, Dr. Schooler has served as a member of the Board of Directors for Postpartum Support Maryland, Thrive Behavioral Health, and Oyster-Adams Community Council.

In 2004, the Council approved the Child in Need of Protection Amendment Act (2004 Act).<sup>1</sup> The purpose of the 2004 Act was to reform the District's child protection law. More importantly, the goal of the Council was to create a seamless and effective system for responding to any type of child mistreatment, whether it was child abandonment, abuse, or neglect.<sup>2</sup> One of the outcomes of the 2004 Act was to codify the establishment of the Citizen Review Panel (Panel). The Panel serves as an independent oversight body for the District's child welfare system and to evaluate the District government agencies involved in child protection as well as services provided by vendors.<sup>3</sup>

Prior to the 2004 Act, the Panel was created administratively because Congress mandated that states and other jurisdictions establish such Panels by July 1999 pursuant to the Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act (CAPTA).<sup>4</sup> The requirement to establish a Panel was necessary to continue to receive CAPTA funds.<sup>5</sup> As required by CAPTA, the Panel evaluates the District's child protection standards pursuant to a state plan required by the federal government and pursuant to child protection standards set by federal law.

The Panel consists of 15 members, all of whom must be District residents.<sup>6</sup> The Mayor is required to appoint eight members of the Panel and must designate the Chairperson. The Council shall appoint seven members to the Panel and is required to designate the Vice Chairperson.<sup>7</sup> Furthermore, the Panel is required to be broadly representative of the community and must include members that have expertise in the prevention and treatment of child abuse and neglect.<sup>8</sup> In addition, the appointments to the Panel should have a diversity of professional backgrounds and must be familiar with the child welfare system.<sup>9</sup>

Dr. Schooler is committed to serve on the Panel to make a meaningful difference in overseeing the District's child welfare and child protection programs and services.<sup>10</sup> She wants to serve on the Panel to be able to give back to the District. Additionally, she intends to use her expertise as a physician to assist the Panel in determining how the physical and psychological needs of District children are being met.<sup>11</sup> During the April 25<sup>th</sup> roundtable, Dr. Schooler testified that she believes that the Child and Family Services Agency should be instituting a community-based approach to serve the needs of District residents.

The Committee believes as a pediatrician Dr. Schooler would be able to help the Panel better assist foster children who tend to have more complex health issues than their non-neglected peers. Dr. Schooler's work at Holy Cross hospital has given her the necessary experience to serve on the Panel as she has cared for children who have been subject to abuse and neglect. The Committee recommends adoption of PR 22-771.

*Dr. Sarah Schooler, Appointee*, testified and answered questions from Chairman Mendelson regarding her background and experience as it pertains to the Citizen Review Panel and her interest in serving on the Panel.

The Committee received no testimony or comments in opposition to Dr. Schooler's appointment.

## VI. IMPACT ON EXISTING LAW

Members of the Citizen Review Panel are appointed pursuant to section 351 of the Prevention of Child Abuse and Neglect Act of 1977, effective April 12, 2005 (D.C. Law 15-341; D.C. Official Code § 4-1303.51), which establishes the Panel.

PR 22-771 will have no fiscal impact on the District of Columbia budget or financial plan. Members of the Citizen Review Panel are not entitled to compensation.
