



Attendance and Discipline Report  
SY 2017-18

## Summary

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Each year, DC PCSB works with public charter local education agencies to track student attendance and disciplinary measures pursuant to the reporting requirements outlined in DC Code § 38-203(i). These measures are significant indicators of the quality learning environments public charter schools provide and the atmosphere students experience. The following report outlines trends in suspensions, expulsions, truancy, and attendance for the 2017-18 school year.

The percentage of students receiving an out of school suspension continues five years of decline to a new low of 7.1%. The rate is half of what it was in school year (SY) 2012-13. Additionally, we saw a drop in the percentage of instruction time lost to out of school suspensions, from 0.41% five years ago to the lowest rate yet of 0.18%. This means that at a school with 500 students, fewer than one student would be out of school for a suspension on any given day.

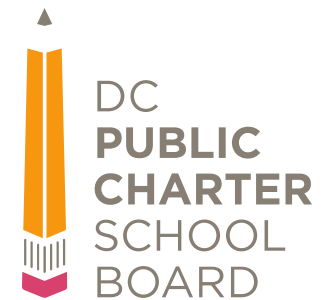
The percent of students expelled dropped to below the national average from 0.22% to 0.15%. This translates to 65 students being expelled from public charter schools last year. The rate is a fraction of what it was in school year 2012-13, when we first started capturing these data.

In-seat attendance, which measures attendance without regard to whether an absence is excused or not, declined by 0.2% to 91.6% and the sector's truancy rate rose from 21.7% to 24.5%. The citywide rise in the truancy rate is concerning and something the Every Day Counts Task Force continues to examine. This increase may be attributed, in part, to schools not being able to accept excuse notes more than five days following an absence. We plan to continue to work with our partners to better understand and solve the larger issues surrounding chronic absenteeism.

Schools are committed to improving attendance and truancy, and to continue the positive trends in expulsion and suspension rates in a fair, equitable manner using approaches consistent with their specific educational philosophy and mission. We expect to see the sector continue its work in ensuring students are attending school every day and growing academically.

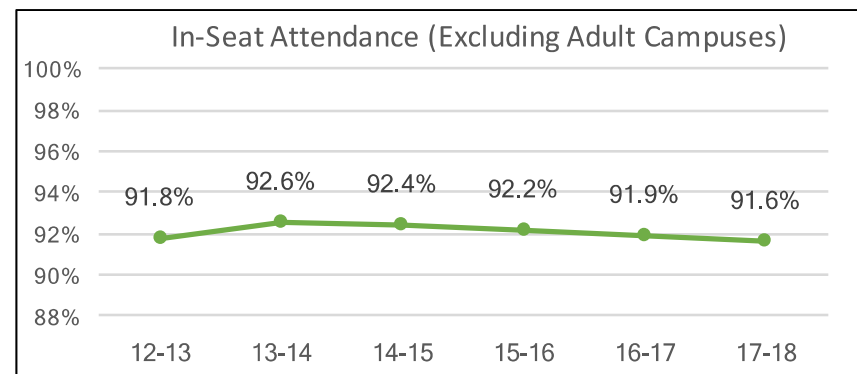
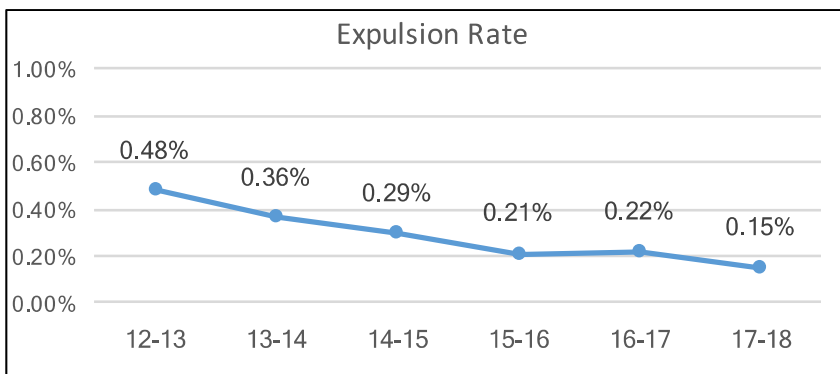
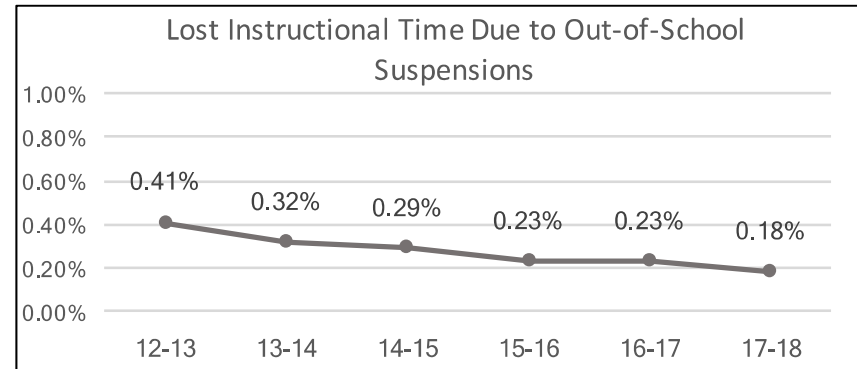
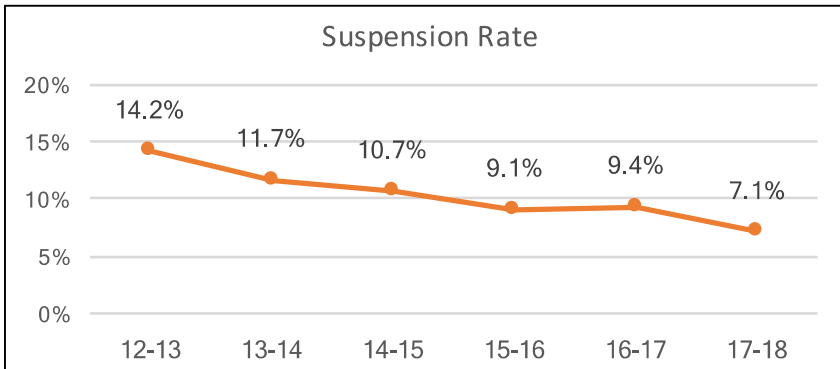
# 2017-18 DC PUBLIC CHARTER SCHOOL DISCIPLINE AND ATTENDANCE

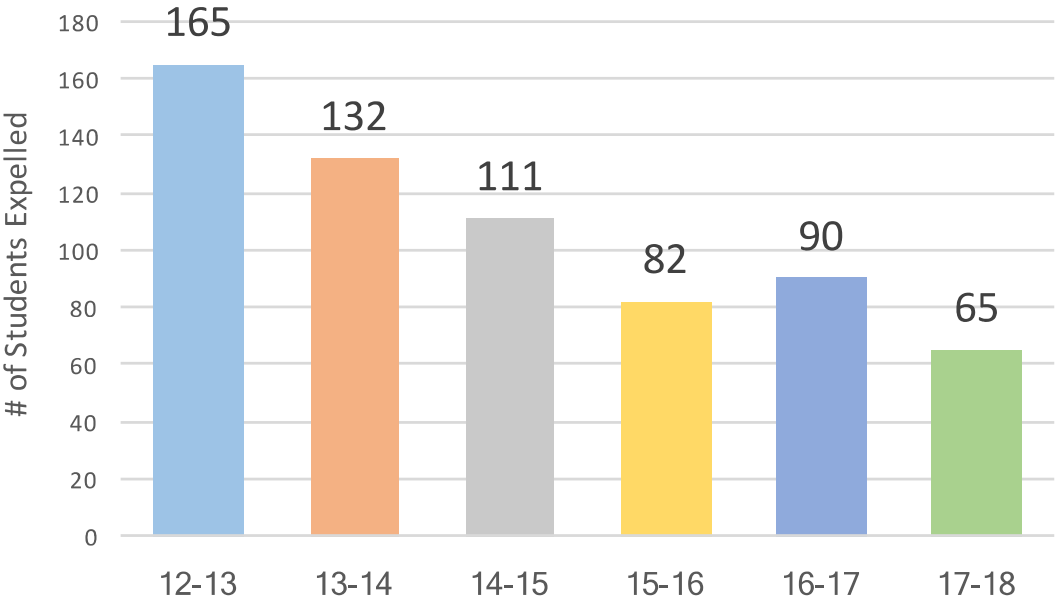

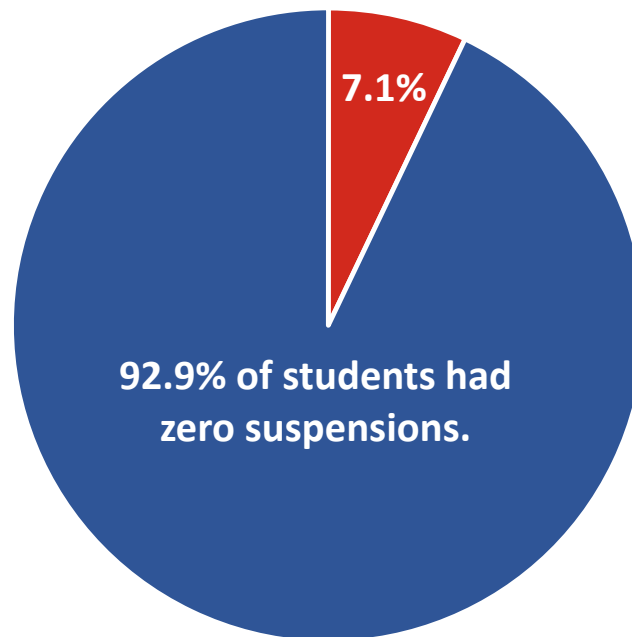

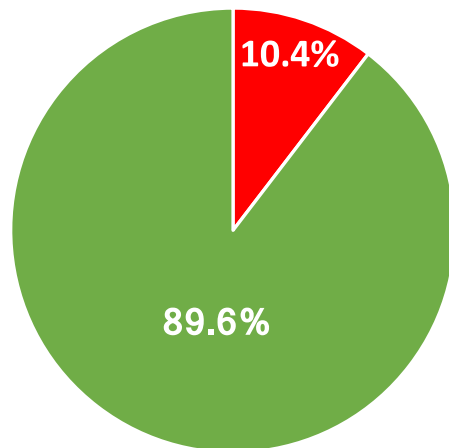

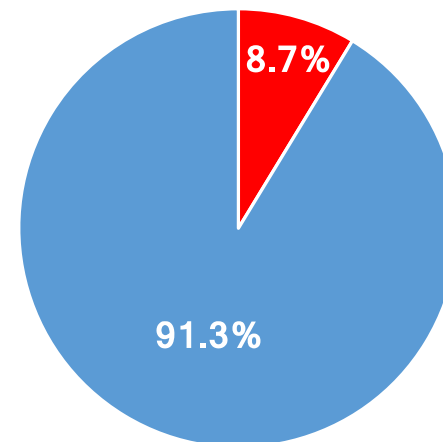

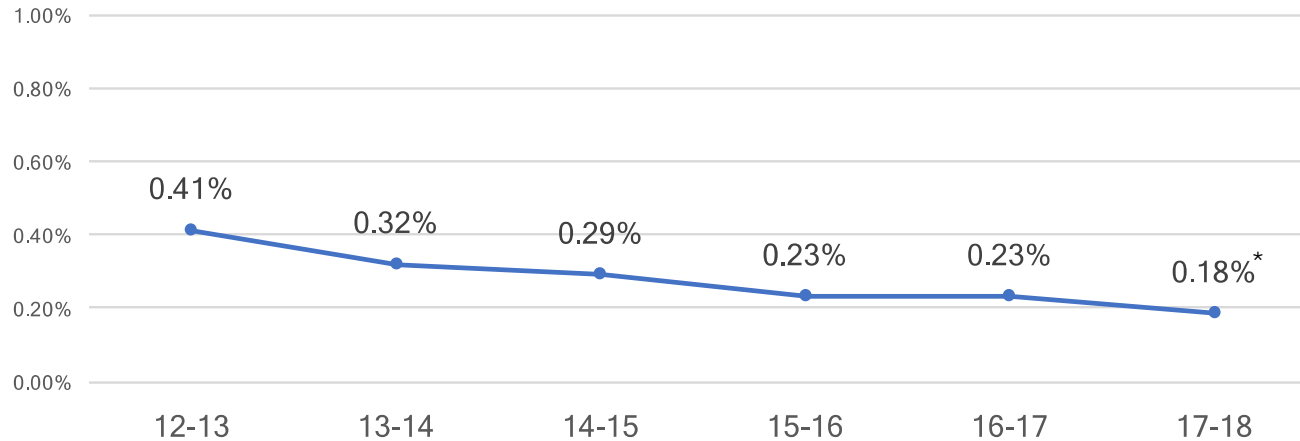

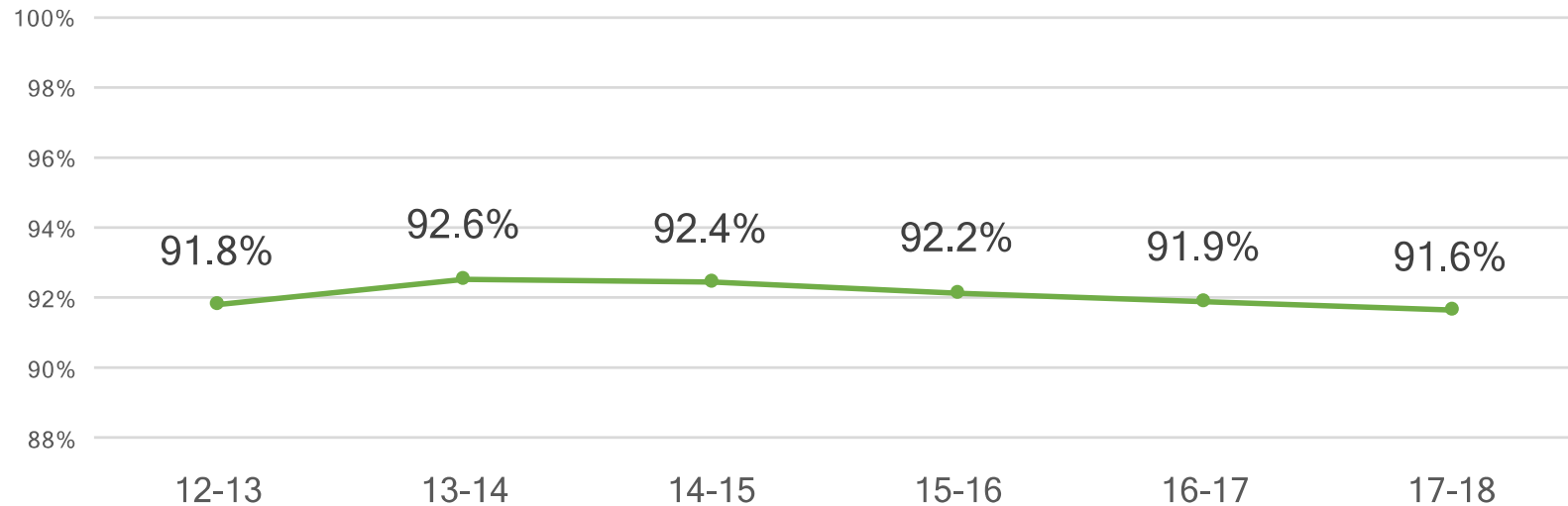
# Our Role in Addressing Discipline

- DC PCSB assesses discipline policies when new applicant groups apply for a charter
- DC PCSB's Enrollment Ceiling Increase Policy includes two indicators on exclusionary discipline
- When schools are up for charter review, we work with the schools on revising charter goals, including goals around discipline
- Schools' discipline policies are posted on DC PCSB's website in each school's Student Handbook. All must have the following:
  - Clear explanation of infractions, consequences and due process
  - Explanation of disciplinary steps for students with disabilities
- We analyze discipline data monthly to look for trends, and alert schools when they are discipline rate outliers

SY 2017-18 Charter Sector Average : **24.5%**  
(up from **21.7%\*** in SY 2016-17)

- The DC PCSB Truancy Policy seeks to reduce absenteeism by encouraging schools to focus on strategies to improve attendance.
- **4** schools received a Notice of Concern in SY 2017-18.
- The Policy compels schools and PCSB staff to track improvement in attendance at the school and student level.

*\*Prior to 2016-17, schools' individual attendance policies set the period of time following an absence in which excuse notes could be accepted. In 2016-17, District policy mandated that schools could not accept excuse notes more than 5 days following an absence. While this does not explain why rates went up from 16-17 to 17-18, we continue to hear school feedback about the difficulty of this rule.*

# Our Role in Improving Attendance & Discipline

- For SY 2018-19, DC PCSB will continue to work with OSSE and charter LEAs to streamline the process for collecting and reporting truancy and discipline data.
- Through **transparency**, we encourage schools to adopt and improve on best practices which increase instructional time. In SY 2017-18, DC PCSB developed a dashboard for schools to view their monthly attendance and discipline data, by grade band or subgroup, as well as comparable charter sector data.
