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22	RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA. That this
23	resolution may be cited as the "COVID-19 Supplemental Corrections Mortgage Relief
24	Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2020".
25	Sec. 2. (a) on March 11, 2020, the Mayor of the District of Columbia issued Mayor's
26	Order 2020-45 and 2020-46, declaring a public emergency and a public health emergency in the
27	District due to the imminent threat to the health, safety, and welfare of District residents posed
28	by the spread of COVID-19. That order is currently in effect through April 24, 2020.
29	(b) On March 17, the Council adopted the COVID-19 Response Amergency
30	Amdnment Act of 2020 (D.C. Act 23-247) that includes provisions to delay the submission
31	of the Mayor's Fiscal Year 2021 budget proposal to May 6, 2020 due to the public health
32	emergency. That bill also includes a provisison to allow many restaurants and taverns to
33	deliver beer, wine, and spirits with carry out or delivery orders of food.
34	( <b><u>c</u>b</b> ) On April 7, 2020, the Council adopted the COVID-19 Response Supplemental
35	Emergency Amendment Act of 2020 (D.C. Act 23-286). One provision of that act is intended

36	tTo mitigate the adverse impacts of the public health emergency, that legislation contained
37	provisions that by directing mortgage providers to establish mortgage relief plans. The act also
38	includes provisisons to prohibit rent increases for residential rental properties and make
39	technical changes regarding beer, wine, and spirit sales. It also contains a provisisons
40	limiting liability to the District with regard to the public health emergency and limiting
41	debt collection during the public health emergency.
42	(d) To ensure the Council gets all relevant budget materials on the date of
43	submission of the budget, the budget submission date must be extended by one week. Also,
44	the Council has determined that the same rent relief afforded to residential tenants in D.C.
45	Act 23-286 should be extended to commercial tenants. Concerns have also been raised that
46	the provision of Act 23-286 regarding District liability under the public health emergency
47	should be narrowed. Also, the Executive has asked that the provision for alcohol delivery
48	originally added to D.C. Act 23-247, and refined in D.C. Act 23-286, be expanded to
49	nightclub licensees.
50	(ee) To ensure this the mortgage relief is most appropriately administered during the
51	public health emergency, the mortgage relief provisions in D.C. Act 23-286 need to be amended
52	to include mortgage lenders as covered entities, require notice of approved deferral applications,
53	and clarify the amount a landlord may require a tenant to repay following the deferral period.
54	Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances in
55	section 2 constitute emergency circumstances, making it necessary that the <b>COVID-19</b>
56	Supplemental Corrections Mortgage Relief Emergency Amendment Act of 2020 be adopted
57	after a single reading.
58	Sec. 4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.
