This program was used in pre-school centers in the South-Bronx and other neighborhoods in New York.

Taught at Jamaica High School in the NYC school system, and part time lecturer of Art History at St. Johns University as well as instructor of studio drawing classes at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City.

Recently retired from a 49-year career as a hotel executive in Washington DC, and in New York City

About the Artists Work:

Working in a range of styles, mediums and imagery, representing works both non-figurative and abstract all an attempt to create works that represent diverse ways to express and respond to a wide rate of interests. More than anything, the body of work manifest ways of giving life to the creative process combined with a passion for experimentation with color and form.

Works on paper or canvas represent an exploration of color, exploiting the contrasts and harmonies created by color, and the emotions and memories they evoke. The use of color to define and create form, even the absence of such.

Often the works take on a level of experimentation in the form of assemblage by mixing and experimenting with textures, found objects and ephemera with occasional journeys to capture fantasy, faith, the familiar and sentimentality.

Many resonate with deep appreciation of artists such as, Klee, Jean Arp, Cornell, Matisse, Davis, Picasso, Miro and too many others to name. However, mostly the works of Artists of the late 40's and 50's that have in so many ways lent of themselves to my vision.

Images and works represent an opportunity to respond to daily life, to go to a place were forms, rhythm, composition and playfulness exists, if only in the imagination. "A place where reality simply does not exist, at least for those few and precious times left to be in a world of my own making".
