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32	BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
33	act may be cited as the "Non-Public Student Educational Continuity and Homeland Security
34	Fusion Center and Law Enforcement Authority Congressional Review Emergency
35	Amendment Act of 2021".
36	Sec. 2. Section 2(e) of the District of Columbia Nonresident Tuition Act, approved
37	September 8, 1960 (74 Stat. 853; D.C. Official Code § 38-302(e)), is amended as follows:
38	(a) Strike the phrase "school, ceases" and insert the phrase "school, or while enrolled in a DCPS
39	or public charter school and attending a non-public school or program pursuant to section 103 of

11	effective March 14, 2007 (D.C. Law 16-269; D.C. Official Code § 38-2561.03) ("Placement
12	Act"), ceases" in its place.
13	(b) Strike the phrase "currently attends." and insert the phrase "currently attends, if the
14	child attends a DCPS or public charter school, or the remainder of the school year in which the
15	change in care and custody occurs and through the end of the following school year, if the child
16	is currently enrolled in a DCPS or public charter school and attending a non-public school or
17	program pursuant to section 103 of the Placement Act." in its place.
18	Sec. 3. An Act To authorize the District of Columbia government to establish an
19	Office of Civil Defense, and for other purposes, approved August 11, 1950 (64 Stat. 438;
50	D.C. Official Code § 7-2201 et seq.), is amended by adding a new section 3a to read as
51	<u>follows:</u>
52	"Sec. 3a. Fusion center.
53	"(a) The Director of the Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency
54	("HSEMA") shall, subject to the direction and control of the Mayor, establish and direct
55	the administration and operations of an intelligence fusion center for the District within
56	HSEMA. The fusion center shall, at the discretion of the Mayor and the Director of
57	HSEMA, also serve as the primary fusion center in the National Capital Region.
8	"(b) The primary mission of the fusion center is to receive, coordinate, and share
59	resources, expertise, and information, including criminal history record information and
60	law enforcement intelligence information, from and among law enforcement, first
51	responder, and criminal justice agencies; to facilitate and coordinate the receipt and
52	sharing of such resources, expertise, and information from and among such agencies; and
63	to analyze, handle, coordinate, and integrate such resources, expertise, and information

64	from and among such agencies, with the goal of detecting and preventing terrorist and
65	other criminal activity, such as criminal conspiracy, bomb threats, possession of illegal
66	firearms and explosives, identity theft, money laundering, hate crimes, and organized
67	crime, and for the purpose of investigating and responding to such activity. The fusion
68	center shall collect, coordinate, and share information with law enforcement agencies only
69	if a reasonable suspicion exists that the subject is involved in specific criminal acts or
70	possible terrorist activity.
71	"(c) The District's intelligence fusion center, which shall be a division of HSEMA, is
72	designated a law enforcement unit for the purposes of carrying out the functions set forth
73	in subsection (b) of this section.
74	"(d) The fusion center shall work in partnership with other state, local, regional,
75	and federal fusion centers and other state, local, regional, and federal law enforcement,
76	criminal justice, and intelligence agencies.
77	"(e) The fusion center shall represent the District's interests in the national network
78	of fusion centers.".
79	Sec. 34. Applicability.
80	This act shall apply as of April 3014, 2021.
81	Sec. 45. Fiscal impact statement.
82	The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impac
83	statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved
84	October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

86	This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
87	Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than

- 88 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section
- 89 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788;
- 90 D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
