#### I. BACKGROUND AND NEED

On November 23, 2022, PR 24-1083, the "Board of Directors of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Spring Worth Appointment Resolution of 2022" was introduced by Chairman Mendelson. The purpose of PR 24-1083 is to appoint Ms. Spring Worth as an alternate member of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) Board of Directors to complete a term to end June 30, 2024.

Ms. Worth is a Ward 4 resident. She received her Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology and History from the University of Rochester, a Master of Public Administration from the City University of New York at Baruch, and has completed other relevant educational programs including the Emerging Leader Program with the American Public Transportation Association (APTA) and the Women's Leadership and Coaching Program with the District Department of Transporation (DDOT). Currently, Ms. Worth serves as the WMATA Budget and Policy Manager for DDOT. Prior to that, she held two other positions at DDOT, serving as Senior Project Manager from 2019 to 2022 and Transportation Planner from 2013 to 2019. Ms. Worth is

a graduate of the District's Capital City Fellows program and currently serves as Chair of the Metropolitan Washington Council of Governments Public Transportation Committee.

The Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) is a regional instrumentality that was created in 1967 through an interstate compact between the District of Columbia, the State of Maryland, and the Commonwealth of Virginia to plan, develop, finance, and operate a regional transportation system in the Washington metropolitan area. Pursuant to the Compact, WMATA is governed by the WMATA Board. The purpose of the WMATA Board is not only to govern WMATA, but to develop policies and provide oversight for the management, maintenance, funding, and operation of the transportation system.

The WMATA Board is comprised of eight principal directors (voting members) and eight alternate directors. The Signatories to the Compact – the District of Columbia, Maryland, and Virginia – and the federal government are required to appoint two voting members and two nonvoting members to the WMATA Board.<sup>1</sup> The members, both voting and non-voting, are appointed by the Council of the District of Columbia (representing the District), the Washington Suburban Transit Commission (representing Maryland), the Northern Virginia Transportation Commission (representing Virginia), and the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Transportation (representing the federal government).<sup>2</sup> Principal and alternate members may be removed or suspended from office only as provided by the law of the Signatory from which he or she was appointed.<sup>3</sup>

In 2012 the Council adopted the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Board of Directors Act.<sup>4</sup> The purpose of this Act is to establish requirements for the appointment and service on the WMATA Board for the four members appointed by the Council.<sup>5</sup> It requires a District appointee: (a) to have experience on issues that would be useful to serving on the WMATA Board; (b) to be a patron of the services provided by WMATA; (c) to limit service to two consecutive four-year terms; (d) to file an annual report with the Council each calendar year regarding his or her attendance record, and an affirmation that the member uses bus, rail, or paratransit services provided by WMATA; (e) to not have been an employee of WMATA within one year of appointment to the WMATA Board; (f) to serve at the pleasure of the Council; and (g) to adhere to the District's Code of Conduct.<sup>6</sup>

Ms. Worth's desire as a WMATA Board alternate director is to shine the light on critical issues and work collaboratively in addressing them. She seeks to use her experience as a transportation practitioner and a daily bus and rail rider to improve the transit experience for District residents. Ms. Worth wants residents across the District to elect to take transit as their primary mode of travel, both for work and entertainment. She also expressed a desire to work with our region's transportation leaders to determine how commute times can be improved for our most vulnerable users, how to reduce our carbon emissions, and ways to stimulate growth in our downtown region post-pandemic. Ms. Worth believes that there is an opportunity for the WMATA Board to take a regional focus regarding our transportation system and how we can collectively make a difference in addressing equity, climate change and economic development. Additionally, she wants the Board to take an equitable approach to Metrobus in setting standards and expectations that are on par with Metrorail.

Based on her credentials and her significant public transportation expertise, the Committee recommends the appointment of Ms. Worth to serve on the WMATA Board of Directors as an alternate member. Moreover, the Committee believes Ms. Worth meets the

requirements to serve on the Board pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 7-755.01. For the reasons stated above, the Committee recommends adoption of PR 24-1083.

Official Code § 9-1107.01(5)), and the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Board of Directors Act of 2012, effective April 27, 2013 (D.C. Law 19-286; D.C. Official Code § 9-1108.11).

#### VI. FISCAL IMPACT

PR 24-1083 will have no fiscal impact on the District of Columbia budget or financial plan. Members of the WMATA Board of Directors are not entitled to compensation.
