30	<del>seq.), Notwithstanding D.C. Official Code § 47-355.02(3),</del> the <del>Council approves<u>Chief</u></del>
31	Financial Officer, or his designee, may approve disbursements for payment -under
32	Purchase Orders <del>PO625875, PO621742-V2, PO630568, PO637947, PO658141-V2,</del>
33	<b>PO679865, and</b> PO687321 to provide occupational and physical therapy for students
34	with individualized education programs, and authorizes payment in the not-to-
