I. BACKGROUND AND NEED

Proposed Resolution 24-770, the "Board of Industrial Trades Brian Cooper Confirmation Resolution of 2022," was introduced by Chairman Mendelson at the request of the Mayor on May 27, 2022 and referred to the Committee of the Whole. The purpose of PR 24-770 is to confirm the Mayor's nomination of Mr. Brian Cooper for reappointment to the Board of Industrial Trades, to serve for a term to end on June 26, 2025.

The Board of Industrial Trades was established to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the District by ensuring that individuals engaged in industrial trades have the specialized skills and training required to perform such activities for the public. The Board governs asbestos workers, plumbers, electricians, refrigeration and air conditioning mechanics, steam and operating engineers, and those in the elevator trades. The Board may establish bonding and insurance requirements, subcategories of licensure, education and experience requirements for licensure, and impose other requirements.

The Board is comprised of 15 tradespersons who are appointed by the Mayor and licensed in the District: three plumbers, two electricians, two refrigeration and air conditioning mechanics, two steam engineers, two asbestos workers, one elevator mechanic, one elevator inspector, one elevator contractor, and one consumer member.

Mr. Cooper has been serving on the Board since 2016. He is an elevator contractor in the District of Columbia. Mr. Cooper is currently President of the Potomac Elevator Company and has held this position since 2005. Prior to this, Mr. Cooper worked as General Manager of the Otis Elevator Company (Bermuda) Ltd in Pembroke, Bermuda and Senior Account Manager for New Equipment for the Otis Elevator Company in Washington, D.C. Mr. Cooper has over 25 years of elevator industry experience. He currently lives in Ward 3.

Based on his continued commitment to the mission of the Board and his expertise as a licensed elevator contractor, the Committee recommends the reappointment of Mr. Cooper to the Board of Industrial Trades. The Committee recommends adoption of PR 24-770.

V. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

The Committee of the Whole held a public roundtable on three Board of Industrial Trade nominations, including PR 24-770, on Thursday, June 30, 2022. The testimony summarized below is from that hearing. Submitted copies of testimony are attached to this report.

Brian Cooper, *Appointee*, testified and answered questions from Chairman Mendelson regarding his background and experience as it pertains to the Board and his interest in serving another term on the Board.

The Board of Industrial Trades is established pursuant to D.C. Code § 47-2853.06(d). PR 24-770 is an exercise of the Council's discretion to approve or disapprove Mayoral nominations to Boards and Commissions, pursuant to the Confirmation Act of 1978 (D.C. Law 2-142; D.C. Code § 1-523.01).

VII. FISCAL IMPACT

The Office of the Chief Financial Officer indicates that a Fiscal Impact Statement is not needed for a confirmation. Board members are not compensated for their service.

Good afternoon, Chairman Mendelson, Councilmembers, and staff. Thank you for holding this hearing and providing me with the opportunity to testify regarding my reappointment to the Board of Industrial Trades. I would also like to thank Mayor Bowser for the nomination.

I have been in the elevator business for 28 years, starting with Otis Elevator Company in Pittsburgh, PA as an Account Manager, moving to the Glover Park neighborhood of Washington, D.C. in 1999 to run Otis Elevator's service sales operations in the Downtown D.C. core. In 2001, I was promoted to Otis' new equipment sales department, selling new elevators throughout the metropolitan area. In 2002, I moved to Bermuda to run Otis Elevator Bermuda LTD's operations. In 2005, my family returned to the District and I started Potomac Elevator Company to provide high quality elevator services for properties in Washington D.C. and the surrounding area. Potomac Elevator Company has grown into a significant, highly regarded provider of elevators and elevator services in the DC and Baltimore metropolitan areas over the last 17 years.

I am very interested and dedicated to the Board of Industrial Trades and its success. I feel strongly about the negative impact of unlicensed trade work on public safety and fair competition. My experience working with both a major multinational and for my own independent elevator company gives me a unique perspective from the management/ownership side of the elevator industry that is important for the Board of Industrial Trades. I strongly believe that my management and organizational skills will help move the Board forward, and set and achieve goals, so that it is an effective and consequential body providing a framework for safe and licensed trade work throughout the city.

My goal for the Board of Industrial trades is to see it progress in an efficient, effective, and organized way. The Board now has a consistent quorum, and a number of subcommittees have been formed to address reoccurring or specific Board initiatives. One of the most important goals of the Board is providing an avenue for trades and their workers to become licensed in a streamlined manner. To this end, the Board is employing endorsement and reciprocity with other jurisdictions to expedite licensing while upholding the requirements of the District.

In closing, I believe the Board of Industrial Trades has made great progress recently as it performs its important work of setting licensing standards and regulating unlicensed work throughout the District of Columbia.
