### I. BACKGROUND AND NEED

Proposed Resolution 24-771, the "Board of Industrial Trades LaVonne Woods Confirmation Resolution of 2022," was introduced by Chairman Mendelson at the request of the Mayor on May 27, 2022 and referred to the Committee of the Whole. The purpose of PR 24-771 is to confirm the Mayor's nomination of Ms. LaVonne Woods for appointment to the Board of Industrial Trades, to serve for a term to end on June 26, 2024.

The Board of Industrial Trades was established to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the District by ensuring that individuals engaged in industrial trades have the specialized skills and training required to perform such activities for the public. The Board governs asbestos workers, plumbers, electricians, refrigeration and air conditioning mechanics, steam and operating engineers, and those in the elevator trades. The Board may establish bonding and insurance requirements, subcategories of licensure, education and experience requirements for licensure, and impose other requirements.

The Board is comprised of 15 tradespersons who are appointed by the Mayor and licensed in the District: three plumbers, two electricians, two refrigeration and air conditioning mechanics, two steam engineers, two asbestos workers, one elevator mechanic, one elevator inspector, one elevator contractor, and one consumer member.

Nominations are pending at the Council.

Ms. Woods is a first-time appointee to the Board. She is a master electrician in the District of Columbia. Ms. Woods is currently a Residential Property Maintenance and Housing Inspector (Independent Contractor) with the District of Columbia Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs. Ms. Woods also leveraged her more than 20 years of electrical trade expertise to found Alpha Power and Alarm Company, where she serves as President and Chief Executive Officer. Prior to her current role, Ms. Woods was the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority Low Voltage AA Power Mechanic and Nichols Power System Journeyman Electrician. She currently lives in Ward 5.

Based on her commitment to the mission of the Board and her expertise as a licensed master electrician, the Committee recommends the appointment of Ms. Woods to the Board of Industrial Trades. The Committee recommends adoption of PR 24-771.

Ms. Woods is the Mayor's nominee for appointment to the Board of Industrial Trades.

### IV. COMMENTS OF ADVISORY NEIGHBORHOOD COMMISSIONS

The Committee received no testimony or comments from any Advisory Neighborhood Commission on PR 24-771.

### V. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

The Committee of the Whole held a public roundtable on three Board of Industrial Trade nominations, including PR 24-771, on Thursday, June 30, 2022. The testimony summarized below is from that hearing. Submitted copies of testimony are attached to this report.

*Larry Greenhill*, *Charles Mann Academy*, testified and answered questions from Chairman Mendelson, in support of LaVonne Woods' nomination to the Board. Mr. Greenhill provided information on his professional experience with the nomination and her work with the Charles Mann Academy.

Andre Allen, Inspector, Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs, testified and answered questions from Chairman Mendelson, in support of LaVonne Woods' nomination to the Board. Mr. Allen provided information on Ms. Woods commitment to mentoring individuals interested in pursuing a career as an electrician.

**LaVonne Woods**, **Appointee**, testified and answered questions from Chairman Mendelson regarding her background and experience as it pertains to the Board and her interest in serving on the Board.

### VI. IMPACT ON EXISTING LAW

The Board of Industrial Trades is established pursuant to D.C. Code § 47-2853.06(d). PR 24-771 is an exercise of the Council's discretion to approve or disapprove Mayoral nominations to Boards and Commissions, pursuant to the Confirmation Act of 1978 (D.C. Law 2-142; D.C. Code § 1-523.01).

### VII. FISCAL IMPACT

The Office of the Chief Financial Officer indicates that a Fiscal Impact Statement is not needed for a confirmation. Board members are not compensated for their service.

### VIII. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS

Section 1	States the short title of PR 24-771.

Good afternoon Chairman Mendelson and members of the Committee of the Whole. My name is LaVonne Woods, and I would like to thank Mayor Bowser for the nomination to serve as the electrician licensed in the District member on the Board of Industrial Trades. I am a native Washingtonian and a life-long resident of Ward 5. I am a graduate of McKinley Tech Senior High School. After high school, I attended Lindenwood College in St. Charles, Missouri. I returned home after one year to be close to my aging grandmother. When I returned home, I worked for the DC Department of Parks and Recreation (DPR) where I worked as a teenager during summers.

After several years with DPR, I realized my true passion and began my apprenticeship with IBEW Local 26. After 5 years, I received my DC journeyman's license. I worked as Journeyman Electrician in the union for 15 more years as a Life Safety Foreman, estimator, and project manager.

I later obtained my DC Electrical Master's license and started an electrical contracting company, Alpha Power and Alarm, which is a DC certified business enterprise. I currently serve as President and Designated Master Electrician. I wanted to be able to train and employ DC residents and show them that they have options for a pathway to the middle class if college isn't what they want to pursue after high school. I also wanted to train and hire returning citizens. I believe that they have paid their debt to society and deserve another chance that many employers are not willing to give them.

Currently, I am employed at WMATA as a low voltage power mechanic. I perform routine installations, maintenance, inspections, and repairs on all WMATA's low voltage electrical equipment.

Just recently, I partnered with The Charles Mann Academy, a division of Charles Mann Enterprises. The Academy is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization focusing on working with disadvantaged individuals in Washington, D.C. who are interested in learning the electrician trade and building a career. The program features a journeyman electrician apprenticeship with one-on-one guidance and support on all the essential aspects of becoming an electrician—including support as a journeyman electrician, as well as hands-on experience under the watchful eye of an industry veteran.

In addition, I am an International Code Council (ICC) Certified Property Maintenance and Housing Inspector. I was a part of the DCRA Resident Inspector Program, in which DCRA trains District residents to perform housing, illegal construction, and vacant building inspections.

I am a competent and skilled Master Electrician with over 20 years of experience, and I am truly eager to serve on this board because I love this city and am proud to be a native Washingtonian. This is my way of giving back to a city that has given me so much, from the late, great Marion Barry, who provided me with my very first job, to now Mayor Bowser, who is working to has allow me, as well as every Washingtonian, "A Fair Shot." I will bring to this board exceptional leadership, interpersonal, and communication skills.
