I. BACKGROUND AND NEED

Proposed Resolution 24-772, the "Board of Industrial Trades Petrick Washington Confirmation Resolution of 2022," was introduced by Chairman Mendelson at the request of the Mayor on May 27, 2022 and referred to the Committee of the Whole. The purpose of PR 24-772 is to confirm the Mayor's nomination of Mr. Petrick Washington for reappointment to the Board of Industrial Trades, to serve for a term to end on June 26, 2025.

The Board of Industrial Trades was established to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the District by ensuring that individuals engaged in industrial trades have the specialized skills and training required to perform such activities for the public. The Board governs asbestos workers, plumbers, electricians, refrigeration and air conditioning mechanics, steam and operating engineers, and those in the elevator trades. The Board may establish bonding and insurance requirements, subcategories of licensure, education and experience requirements for licensure, and impose other requirements.

The Board is comprised of 15 tradespersons who are appointed by the Mayor and licensed in the District: three plumbers, two electricians, two refrigeration and air conditioning mechanics, two steam engineers, two asbestos workers, one elevator mechanic, one elevator inspector, one elevator contractor, and one consumer member.

Mr. Washington has been serving on the Board since 2016. Mr. Washington is currently an Elevator Mechanic with TK Elevator. In Mr. Washington's current and former roles, he has focused on the installation and modernization of elevators and associated equipment. A Ward 8 resident, Mr. Washington received an Elevator Mechanic License upon completion of a four-year National Elevator Industry Educational Program apprenticeship. Mr. Washington also possesses a Welder Certification and achieved an Occupational Safety and Health Administration Construction Safety and Health Certification and a Signalman and Rigger I Certification. Mr. Cooper has over 20 years of specialized experience in the elevator mechanics industry.

Based on his continued commitment to the mission of the Board and his expertise as an elevator inspector, the Committee recommends the reappointment of Mr. Washington to the Board of Industrial Trades. The Committee recommends adoption of PR 24-772.

V. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

The Committee of the Whole held a public roundtable on three Board of Industrial Trade nominations, including PR 24-772, on Thursday, June 30, 2022. The testimony summarized below is from that hearing. Submitted copies of testimony are attached to this report.

Petrick Washington, **Appointee**, testified and answered questions from Chairman Mendelson regarding his background and experience as it pertains to the Board and his interest in serving another term on the Board.

VI. IMPACT ON EXISTING LAW

The Board of Industrial Trades is established pursuant to D.C. Code § 47-2853.06(d). PR 24-772 is an exercise of the Council's discretion to approve or disapprove Mayoral nominations to Boards and Commissions, pursuant to the Confirmation Act of 1978 (D.C. Law 2-142; D.C. Code § 1-523.01).

VII. FISCAL IMPACT

The Office of the Chief Financial Officer indicates that a Fiscal Impact Statement is not needed for a confirmation. Board members are not compensated for their service.

VIII. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS

Section 1	States the short title of PR 24-772.

Section 3	Requires that a copy of the resolution, upon adoption, be transmitted to the appointee, the chairperson of the Board, and to the Mayor.
