I. BACKGROUND AND NEED

Proposed Resolution 24-774, the "Board of Industrial Trades Tanya Lewis Confirmation Resolution of 2022," was introduced by Chairman Mendelson at the request of the Mayor on March 27, 2022 and referred to the Committee of the Whole. The purpose of PR 24-774 is to confirm the Mayor's nomination of Ms. Tanya Lewis for reappointment to the Board of Industrial Trades, to serve for a term to end on June 26, 2024.

The Board of Industrial Trades was established to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the District by ensuring that individuals engaged in industrial trades have the specialized skills and training required to perform such activities for the public. The Board governs asbestos workers, plumbers, electricians, refrigeration and air conditioning mechanics, steam and operating engineers, and those in the elevator trades. The Board may establish bonding and insurance requirements, subcategories of licensure, education and experience requirements for licensure, and impose other requirements.

The Board is comprised of 15 tradespersons who are appointed by the Mayor and licensed in the District: three plumbers, two electricians, two refrigeration and air conditioning mechanics, two steam engineers, two asbestos workers, one elevator mechanic, one elevator inspector, one elevator contractor, and one consumer member.

Ms. Lewis has been serving on the Board since 2003. Ms. Lewis is President and owner of TRULITE Electrical Services, LLC, a full-service electrical contracting firm with a Certified Business Enterprise (CBE) certification in the District. Ms. Lewis previously worked at American University where she was a Master Electrician within the Energy and Engineering Department. Prior to that, she worked at the District of Columbia Housing Authority, and the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs. Additionally, Ms. Lewis currently holds a Master Electrician license in the District and is a member of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW) Local #26. Ms. Lewis meets the qualifications for appointment, and she has expressed a commitment to continue serving. Based on her continued commitment to the mission of the Board and her expertise as a licensed electrician, the Committee recommends the reappointment of Ms. Lewis to the Board of Industrial Trades, and the adoption of PR 24-774.

V. SUMMARY OF TESTIMONY

The Committee of the Whole held a public roundtable on three Board of Industrial Trade nominations, including PR 24-774, on Thursday, June 30, 2022. The testimony summarized below is from that hearing. Submitted copies of testimony are attached to this report.

Tanya Lewis, *Appointee*, testified and answered questions from Chairman Mendelson regarding her background and experience as it pertains to the Board and her interest in serving another term on the Board.

VI. IMPACT ON EXISTING LAW

The Board of Industrial Trades is established pursuant to D.C. Code § 47-2853.06(d). PR 24-774 is an exercise of the Council's discretion to approve or disapprove Mayoral nominations to Boards and Commissions, pursuant to the Confirmation Act of 1978 (D.C. Law 2-142; D.C. Code § 1-523.01).

VII. FISCAL IMPACT

The Office of the Chief Financial Officer indicates that a Fiscal Impact Statement is not needed for a confirmation. Board members are not compensated for their service.

VIII. SECTION-BY-SECTION ANALYSIS



Good day, Chairman Mendelson, and members of the Committee of the Whole. My name is Tanya Lewis, and I would like to thank you for holding today's hearing. I also want to thank Mayor Bowser for nominating me and providing the opportunity to continue to serve on the Board of Industrial Trades. I am a Master Electrician with more than 39 years of experience in government and private sectors with demonstrated expertise in the National Electrical Code (NEC), International Code Council (ICC) and International Building Code (IBC) codes, and the District of Columbia Building Codes (DCMR Titles 12 and 14). As a certified NCCER Instructor, I am also proficient in electrical theory, methodologies, application, systems, and compliance code regulations and requirements.

Since 1997, I have been the owner, President, and Master Electrician of TRULITE Electrical Services, LLC, located in Ward 7 in Washington, DC. I have provided a full range of electrical, electrical project management, and consultation services to the following District-based organizations and agencies, including but not limited to:

- DC Deputy Mayor's Office for Planning & Economic Development
- DC Department of General Services
- Wesley Theological Seminary College
- DC Housing Authority (DCHA)

For example, in 2014, I received the Department of General Services Certificate of Appreciation for being one of the Top CBE's for TRULITE Electrical Services. I also received the D.C Board of Industrial Trades Certificate of Appreciation in 2003 - 2012 and the DCRA Certificate of Appreciation in 2004 and 2005.

My professional background and experience undergird my qualifications to continue to serve on the Board of Industrial Trades. I have a demonstrated commitment to the electrical industry with more than 39 years of experience starting as an electrical helper, and then moving on to be an electrical apprentice, electrician, electrical foreman, Master Electrician, estimator, and project manager. As the first female Electrical Inspector, Electrical Supervisor for DCRA and first female to serve on the Board of Industrial Trades, I have contributed to breaking down gender barriers and encouraging greater representation of women in the building trades. I continue to serve as a mentor for aspiring electricians as a certified electrical instructor and business owner in the District of Columbia. I believe the building trades offer our young people tremendous opportunities for gainful employment and a pathway to the middle class in respected professional occupations, with the added benefit of contributing to redevelopment initiatives in their communities.

In addition, my personal experiences have and continue to demonstrate a commitment to my city and community. For example, during my earlier years, I was a Concert Pianist and singer, performing in classical music recitals throughout the District of Columbia. This experience allowed me to appreciate the transformational power of good music in uplifting our communities. In later years, as a business owner and professional, I taught and mentored students, serving as a positive role model for aspiring young tradesmen and women. Perhaps the most defining personal experience of my life occurred when I participated in an episode of the reality TV show "Restaurant Impossible – White House Edition" and had an opportunity to meet the Former First Lady, Michelle Obama. During the episode, I helped to construct two apartments and converted them into kitchen and dining areas for Horton's Kids, a Non-Profit Organization that provides meals to underprivileged children and cooking classes.

I have and will continue to commit the time and personal and professional resources needed to help achieve the initiatives of the board and DCRA's strategic goals and objectives. During my tenure on the board, I was instrumental along with my fellow board members in spearheading reciprocity agreements with Maryland and Virginia, which allowed the District to accept licensed electricians from these states to serve in DC and helped to discourage unlicensed activity. I am currently spearheading efforts to implement continuing education and training for electricians to help them stay abreast of new developments in the field, as well as changes in codes and regulations. If confirmed to continue my board service, I plan to participate in regulatory reform initiatives, ensuring implementation of Bi-Annual Continued Education for all Licensure Trades/Tradesmen working and operating in the District of Columbia, on Construction Residential, Commercial and Industrial Sites specifically in the Business, Professional, and Occupational Licensing (BPOL), and Board of Industrial Trades Subcommittees.
